Deacon Steve and his wife Teal relocated to Grasonville, MD during the summer of 2021 from northwestern New Jersey. They have been married just over 40 years and have two daughters. He then joined Pinnacle Foods and retired as Sr Vice President of Research & Development, Productivity and Project Management in 2019.

Deacon Steve and Teal love to travel and have been very fortunate to travel to many places around the world together and on a number of great pilgrimages. They love animals and miss their farm, but thoroughly enjoy the Eastern Shore.





Pope Francis consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary during a penitential prayer service in St. Peter's Basilica, March 25. On the same day Cardinal

Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner, will carry out a similar consecration at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal.

When Mary appeared to the three shepherd children in Fatima in 1917, she told them, "God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace." Warning of "war, famine, and persecutions of the church and of the Holy Father," Mary told the children, "to prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart."

This is especially needed these days as war abounds so let us join the Holy Father in prayer.

O Lord our God, look down with mercy on the Ukrainian people. Protect and save them from the unjust aggressors who seek to subdue them. Grant them steadfast trust in your mercy and protection.

O Mother of God, who gave us your miraculous icon at Zarvanytsia, intercede for the Ukrainian people, who run to the shelter of your mercy in their times of need.


O Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Grant peace and protection to the people of Ukraine. Give them strength and courage to defend what is good, right, and holy.

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today's Gospel is a story about how a family relates to one another. How would you describe the relationships in your own family? After hearing the story of the prodigal son, which character do you relate to the most?


Mercy and forgiveness are lessons that we all must learn.


