To see in those in need the face of Christ

Pope Francis consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary during a penitential prayer service in St. Peter's Basilica, March 25. On the same day Cardinal

Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner, will carry out a similar consecration at the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal.

When Mary appeared to the three shepherd children in Fatima in 1917, she told them, "God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved, and there will be peace." Warning of "war, famine, and persecutions of the church and of the Holy Father," Mary told the children, "to prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart."

This is especially needed these days as war abounds so let us join the Holy Father in prayer.

O Lord our God, look down with mercy on the Ukrainian people. Protect and save them from the unjust aggressors who seek to subdue them. Grant them steadfast trust in your mercy and protection.

O Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Grant peace and protection to the people of Ukraine. Give them strength and courage to defend what is good, right, and holy.

Hear our prayers, O Lord, and deliver us from distress, for You are merciful and compassionate and love mankind.

To You we give glory: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever.

Parent Connect

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today's Gospel is a story about how a family relates to one another. How would you describe the relationships in your own family? After hearing the story of the prodigal son, which character do you relate to the most?

Lent is a wonderful time to experience God's forgiveness and mercy in the sacrament of reconciliation. Before Easter, schedule a time for you and your older children to celebrate this sacrament. Children under the age of six do not truly comprehend the idea of sinning, so you may want to ask them to think of a time they did something wrong and you hugged them and kissed them. Explain that God is like a forgiving parent.

Mercy and forgiveness are lessons that we all must learn.

You are invited to participate in the Mass of the Blessing of the Oils and the Consecration of the Chrism on Tuesday, April 12th at 7:00 p.m. at the Church of the Holy Cross in Dover, Delaware.

The Chrism Mass is celebrated annually to provide the holy oils for the celebration of the sacraments; the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens and the Sacred Chrism that will be used in the Sacrament of Confirmation as well as in Baptism and the ordination of bishops and priests.

The priests of our diocese concelebrate and renew their commitments to priestly service during this Mass which is one of the most solemn and significant liturgies of the church year.
